Msg #2217 Your Cross-Eyed-BearWhat The Bible SaysGood Samaritan's Penny Pulpit by Pastor Ed RiceYou can choose to live in Philippians 1:21, “For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain ...”, or in Philippians 2:21, “For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ’s ...”, but you cannot live in both. Choose wisely, grasshopper. The imprisoned Apostle Paul was teaching the Philippians how to rejoice in adversity when the subject came up. He was rejoicing because the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ was being preached on every hand because of his trial (1:18), and now he revels in the real meaning and purpose of his life, ... and death.I have sketched a little cartoon of a cross-eyed-bear in the margin of my Bible at chapter 2 verse 8, “And being found in fashion as a man, (Christ) humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.” The little bear cross references me to two more bears in Matthew, two in Mark, and two in Luke, all being scriptures speaking things like, “Whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple” (Luke 14:27, the other five Gospel reference are easily found by a ready Bible student, but the sketch of a cross-eyed-bear should be done in pencil until one gets the cartoon perfected).
